Ms Sandhu

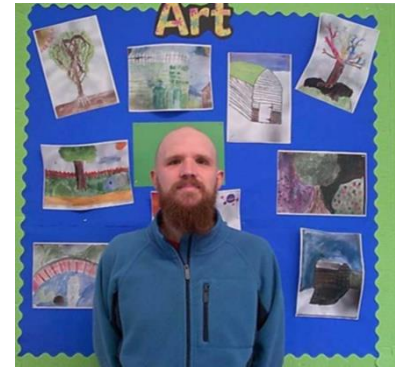
